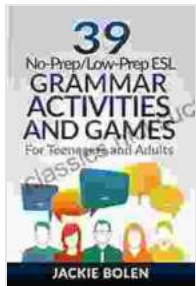

Create catchy songs or chants that incorporate grammar rules. Students can sing or chant along to reinforce their understanding.

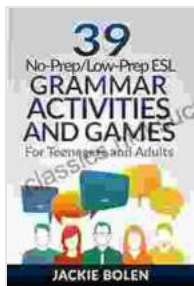

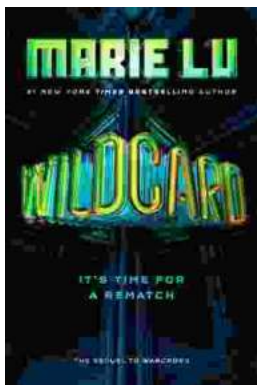
