

The Power of Saying No




Reflecting on their journey, the Thompsons believe that saying no to the initial mission trip was one of the best decisions they ever made.

Their story is a testament to the power of following your instincts and making choices that align with your values. Sometimes, saying no can lead to the biggest yes of your life.


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
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
